For over 23 years, Alpha-Omega Miracle Home (AOMH) has served the most vulnerable in our community. Our mission is to demonstrate God's love in providing housing, comprehensive support and accountability to young mothers, their children, and senior women facing homelessness.

This has been a big year for Alpha-Omega Miracle Home. We broke ground on a new campus that when complete will triple our G.R.O.W Program housing capacity and double the amount of affordable housing units we can offer. The horizontal infrastructure work of Phase One is set to be completed by January 2024. Our hope is that we will be able to begin building our first set of apartments in the fourth quarter of 2024.

Meanwhile, we have seen some amazing women graduate from our program with degrees in hand and careers on the horizon. We have seen our senior community thrive as they have connected with one another and formed sweet bonds with the young moms and children. We have seen moms lay hold of the truth about their identity in Christ, thriving in parenting, faith, and education. We have truly seen miracles!






AOMH FINANCIAL AND HISTORICAL DATA



Founded in 2007 to broadly increase care for homeless and low-income families. Many parents have to choose between buying food or diapers. Alpha-Omega's Community Diaper Bank provides free diapers, formula, baby food and other needed items for families experiencing economic need.

Before I cried out to Jesus, my life was marked by numerous addictions. I was like a robot surviving each day by numbing deep wounds. After I got clean, the Lord brought my daughter and me to Alpha-Omega Miracle Home.

At Alpha-Omega, it was the first time I experienced someone wanting to know me without wanting something in return. I am loved and cared for. I had to yield all the way, however, and receive what was being poured into me, even when I didn't like it. There were times that I wanted to leave. But what I was being given was exactly what I needed. Without Alpha-Omega, I would not have a relationship with my daughter. I get to see her dance and laugh and be happy. Right now, I am getting my GED, I have a job, and I'm saving for a car. I also know in the deepest places that I am loved and forgiven. I have been given

an opportunity to thrive in the here and now along with the promise of heaven. I am so thankful for the love, time, and sacrifice of the staff at Alpha-Omega. It has made a world of difference.

RACHEL'S STORY

I found myself pregnant my sophomore year of high school. I lived next door to Lisa Franklin and was best friends with her daughter. I knew about Alpha-Omega but never thought I'd need their help. I had secretly planned to get an abortion but that same day my mom took me to Lisa's house to pray instead.



At 8 months pregnant, I still didn't know what I was going to do until God spoke through a quote on TV. "Loving someone doesn't mean you want to be with them no matter what, loving someone means you want what's best for someone no matter what." I knew at that moment that I was to give the gift of adoption.



Alpha-Omega was able to coordinate all the details. I was able to meet my son's adoptive parents before he was born. They named my son, Phillip, after his adoptive dad.

When I signed the papers releasing him, I asked God one more thing..."Please bring him back to me one day."

In God's faithfulness, when Phillip was 15, the age I was when I had him, he reached out. I met Philip with his parents. I now have a relationship with him. He spends Thanksgiving with me and we are in touch.

Looking back, I had such peace. I didn't feel like I was losing my son, I felt like I was growing my family. This was all possible because God is good and because of the amazing support of family, friends, my church community and especially Lisa and Alpha-Omega Miracle Home.
